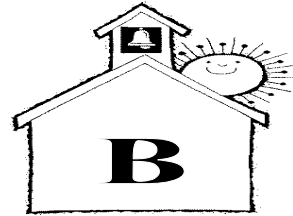


BOB THOMAS EQUESTRIAN CENTER

Everyday except Monday, February 15th.

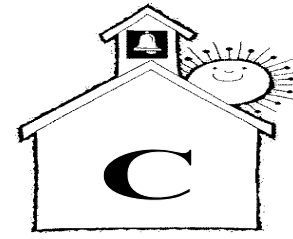


LIVESTOCK BARN

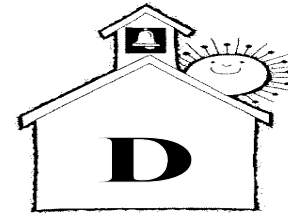


MILKING PARLOR PRESENTED BY DAIRY FARMER'S, INC

Students will see a modern milking parlor in operation. The process is explained by our Milk Man and students might get a chance to help out.

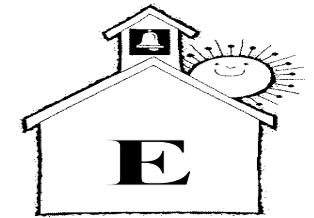

RABBIT AND POULTRY BARN

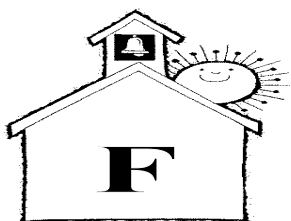
In the Rabbit and Poultry barn, students will see a wide variety of different breeds of rabbits and chickens. At educational displays, students can see eggs hatching, baby chicks, litters of baby rabbits and Champion Row. There is also extensive educational signage.



AGRICULTURAL HALL OF FAME / AG SHOWCASE

The Ag Hall of Fame/ Ag Showcase building is a presentation of Florida's wide variety of agricultural products. This year, the building will focus on the Equine Industry in Florida. Students can learn about current and past Show Jumping Champions of local and national shows. In addition, you can learn about Florida strawberries, citrus, bees, poultry, beef cattle and MORE!!!

- ◆ **Ag Hall of Fame** - Also located in the Ag Showcase building, students can take a look at the lives and accomplishments of the past Ag Hall of Fame Inductees. Four computers allow students to see video presentations on famous people in Florida's agricultural history.
- ◆ **Insect Encounter** - As part of the Ag Showcase Building, students can learn about insects. The booth will have information on insects with exotic animal common names (ant lion, zebra swallowtail, etc) and they will learn about metamorphosis. There will be hands-on activities, such as being able to scoop out an ant lion larvae and measure it.



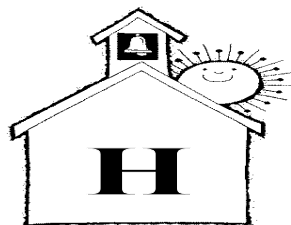
**SALUTE TO AG EXHIBIT/

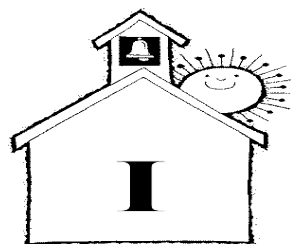
PUREBRED DOG TENT

AG-VENTURE BUILDING

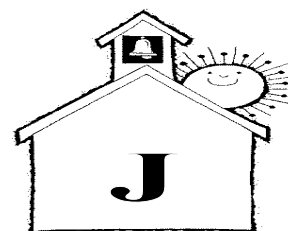

FLORIDA LIVING CENTER

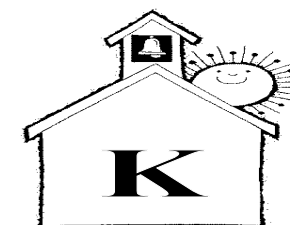
This building is a true showcase of Florida and its citizens.

- ◆ **Fine Art Exhibit** - View a variety of art done by students from across the state.

- ◆ **County Exhibits** - The State Fair features exhibits from counties throughout Florida. These unique exhibits allow students to see the great diversity of Florida agriculture and industry. Students will learn where the counties are located within the state and a few facts about each county.

This fascinating exhibit is presented and explained by employees of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. Students can see a variety of native fresh & salt water fish, as well as snakes, a bear, a panther and more.



CRACKER COUNTRY

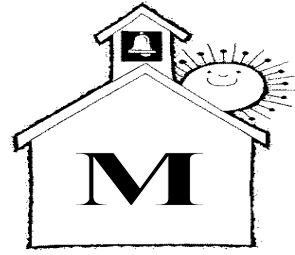
Cracker Country is a village concept where cultural and architectural history has been preserved for future generations. History is presented in a living, interpretative atmosphere that accurately reflects life as it was in Florida at the turn of the century.

- ◆ **School House** - Stop by the one room school house built in 1915 in the Castalia Community in what is now Hardee County. This one room school house features an animatronics teacher and students interacting in a school lesson from the early 1900's.
- ◆ **Blacksmith** - See a real Blacksmith at work. The blacksmith was one of the most important members of the pioneer community. The pioneers depended on him to make cooking utensils, horse shoes, and farm tools.
- ◆ **Train Depot** - The Okahumpka Depot was built in 1898 in what is today Lake County, as part of the Henry B. Plant railroad system. In the freight room of the depot is a 500 square foot model train display of Central Florida at the turn of the century. This display took over 3,000 hours to build. The caboose that sits along side the depot was built in 1917 and was one of the last wooden cabooses used in Florida.



FLORIDA FOREST DISCOVERY CENTER

The Florida Forest Discovery Center is an interpretative, educational exhibit consisting of numerous displays for visitors to learn about the ecological and economic value of forests. Among the numerous displays to be found in the Center will be “Tree Products” display highlighting many tree products found in homes everywhere, a collection of antique forestry tools, and a “Smokey & Friends Stage and Screen” where many presentations concerning wildfire prevention efforts will be featured.



STEAM ENGINES

Students can see the concept of simple machinery in action through a variety of steam engines that have been restored to their original condition and are fully operational and functional.
